

Disney International College Program

Students will be placed in entry-level positions at one of the four *Walt Disney World* Resort theme parks, two water parks or 15 hotels. Students will work approximately 30 to 40 hours per week and will receive an hourly wage.



Participants live in company-sponsored, fully furnished, one- to four-bedroom apartments near the *Walt Disney World* Resort. A housing fee covers utilities, high-speed Internet, and local phone service. This charge is deducted from participants' weekly paychecks. A bus system provides students with transportation to work, classes, and shopping.

Summer Program in Intercultural Communication



Today's global economy requires college graduates to develop the cross-cultural skills they will need to compete and succeed in a

diverse and multicultural workforce.

To meet this growing demand, The Florida State University is offering an exciting program for independent, responsible students who are serious about their academic work. This program combines academic coursework with a paid internship at the *Walt Disney World* Resort.

Students spend the first nine days on the beautiful Florida State University campus located in Tallahassee, Florida taking an intensive 3-credit course in intercultural communication in the FSU Department of Communication. In addition, students do field work, practicing and observing intercultural communication and interactions.

They also begin a 3-credit course designed to help prepare them for living and working in the United States by developing cross-cultural skills.

Throughout their stay at FSU, three FSU students serve as Peer Mentors to provide support to the students, and will live and eat with the students as well as facilitate a variety of social and cultural activities.



Then, it's off to the *Walt Disney World* Resort for a six-month internship in which students earn 12 additional FSU credits, for a total of 15 FSU credits. These 12 credits include the 6 credit internship, the continuation of the cross-cultural seminar for 3 credits, and a 3-credit Disney Collegiate Course.

Program fee of **\$3,700** includes:

- Room and board at FSU
- Group pick-up at Tallahassee airport
- Transportation to Orlando from Tallahassee
- Program related field trips, social and cultural activities
- Textbooks and materials for FSU course
- FSU polo shirt
- Health Insurance
- Bed linens, pillow and towels
- FSU ID Card
- Ongoing support from FSU staff
- 15 FSU credits for coursework at FSU and internship



Eligibility: Students must be in good academic standing at their home institution and pass an oral interview with a *Walt Disney World* recruiter.
