Resumo	<p>Introduction: Resistance to antibiotics is a major problem worldwide, compromising our ability to control infections. Dentists are responsible for significant antibiotic prescription rates.</p> <p>Development: The protocols used by dentists are still controversial in the literature and in clinical practice. There is no consensus in the literature regarding the need to use antibiotics in surgeries for third molars, in patients without previous infection. Due to resistance to antibiotics, the establishment of safe protocols based on clinical and scientific information is extremely important.</p> <p>Conclusion: In this article, a literature review was conducted on the prophylactic use of antibiotics in patients without an infectious process, during the removal of included third molars and the possibility of taking the selection of resistant strains from the dysbiosis caused in the oral microbiota</p>
